***If unable to fit with N95, a KN95 or procedure mask are acceptable according to CDC emergency recommendations for COVID-19. PAPR units are also available at the Telecare Center and the Inpatient Unit. ***

All staff to wear a medical grade mask at all visits. <u>It is strongly recommended to wear a mask and eyewear at all visits</u>, as this is considered non-exposure. N95 required for nebulizing procedures or within 2 hours of procedure, CPAP, BiPap or trilogy ventilator.
